

Initiative

1. Initiative Reveals How Much Someone Truly Sees You

Care without initiative is care based on prompts.

Care with initiative is care based on perception.

Most people are not unkind — they are *unseeing*.

Initiative requires:

- attention,
- emotional literacy,
- observation,
- and a level of awareness that picks up on needs before they escalate.

If someone has initiative toward you, it means you're **in their awareness field**, not just their peripheral.
